#### Reitumetse Obakeng Mabokela

Vice Provost for International Affairs and Global Strategies University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign

United States of America Professor Reitumetse Obakeng Mabokela is the Vice-Provost for International Affairs and Global Strategy and Professor of Comparative and International Higher Education at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Originally from South Africa, she received her BA in Economics from Ohio Wesleyan University, magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. She graduated with a Master's in Labor & Industrial Relations and a Ph.D in Educational Policy Studies, both from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Prof. Mabokela's research seeks to understand experiences of marginalized populations and aims to inform higher education policies that affect these groups. Her research centers or has centered on the examination of three interrelated themes: 1) organizational change and organizational culture in higher education; 2) gender in higher education; and 3) higher education in transitional societies. She has devoted a significant part of her career over the past two decades studying these education issues in South Africa, Namibia, Tanzania, Ghana, Egypt, and Pakistan among others. She is the author, co-author, editor or co-editor of seven books and has published extensively in academic journals including Comparative Education Review, American Educational Research Journal, The Review of Higher Education, Comparative Education, and Higher Education, among others.

Way Kuo is President of City University of Hong Kong (CityU). He is a Member of US National Academy of Engineering and Academia Sinica in Taiwan, and a Foreign Member of Chinese Academy of Engineering and Russian Academy of Engineering. He is also a Life Fellow of IEEE.

Before joining CityU, Professor Kuo was on the Senior Management team of Oak Ridge National Lab and served as Dean of Engineering at the University of Tennessee and Head of the Department of Industrial Engineering at Texas A&M University. He received his PhD in engineering in 1980 from Kansas State University, and BS in nuclear engineering in 1972 from National Tsing Hua University, Taiwan.

Professor Kuo specialises in design for reliability of electronics systems and is the author and co-author of eight academic books, some of which are deemed classics in systems optimization design. His footprints can be found in many modern electronics products.

His popular science book Critical Reflections on Nuclear and Renewable Energy has created an impact since its publication in 2013 by Commonwealth Publishing Group in Taiwan. The book has been translated into English, Japanese, French, Russian, and Korean, published in Massachusetts, Tokyo, Paris, Moscow and Seoul, respectively. This book has also been published in Hong Kong and Beijing in both traditional and simplified Chinese under different titles.

His recent book on higher education: Soulware within Higher Education was published in 2016 by three publishing houses in Hong Kong, Taipei and Beijing simultaneously, which is a rare phenomenon. Its Japanese edition was published in 2017. The English edition will be published by Scrivener and Wiley.

Andrew Petter is the President and Vice Chancellor of Simon Fraser University and Professor in the School of Public Policy. Prior to joining SFU in 2010, he was Professor in the Faculty of Law of the University of Victoria where he served as Dean from 2001 to 2008. He previously taught at Osgoode Hall Law School and practiced law with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Justice.

From 1991 to 2001, Professor Petter served as a Member of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia and held numerous cabinet portfolios, including Aboriginal Affairs, Advanced Education and Attorney General.

He has written extensively in areas of Constitutional Law and Public Policy, including works on the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and Canadian federalism.

Professor Petter holds an LL.B. from University of Victoria and an LL.M. from Cambridge University. He is a member of the British Columbia and Saskatchewan law societies.

Since becoming President, Professor Petter has overseen the development and implementation of a Strategic Vision that seeks to distinguish SFU as a "leading engaged university defined by its dynamic integration of innovative education, cutting edge research, and far-reaching community engagement."

Umran İnan (BS'73–MS'74–PhD'77) received his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Electrical Engineering from Middle East Technical University, Ankara, Turkey, in 1972 and 1973, respectively, and the Ph.D. degree in Electrical Engineering from Stanford University, Stanford, CA, in 1977.

Prof. İnan is the President of Koç University in Istanbul, Turkey. During 1982-2009, he served at Stanford University, as a Professor of Electrical Engineering and as Director of the Space, Telecommunications, and Radioscience Laboratory. He has authored more than 366 scientific publications with 11,800 citations (h-index=58), and served as the Principal Advisor for 60 PhD students since 1990.

Prof. Inan is a Fellow of the American Geophysical Union, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineering (IEEE) and the American Physical Society (APS). He has served as Vice President of the International Union of Radio Science (URSI). He is the recipient of the 2007 Stanford University Allan V. Cox Medal for Faculty Excellence: the 1998 Stanford University Tau Beta Pi Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching; several Group Achievement Awards from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the European Space Agency: the Antarctic Service Medal of the U.S.. with an Antarctic Mountain named "Inan Peak" in his honor; and the 2008 Appleton Prize from URSI and the Royal Society. Professor İnan recently received 2010 Special Science Award from the Scientific and Technological Research Council (TUBITAK) of Turkey, and was elected as a Member of the Turkish Academy of Sciences (TUBA).

Dr. Yong-Hak Kim received his bachelor's degree in sociology from Yonsei University, and his master's and doctorate degrees in sociology from the University of Chicago in 1986. Since beginning his professorship at Yonsei University in 1987, Dr. Kim had taken various senior administrative positions, including Vice-Director of Planning, Director of Admissions, and Dean of the University College, the College of Social Sciences, and the Graduate School of Public Administration. He became the 18th President of Yonsei University in February 2016.

Recognized for his academic achievements, Dr. Kim received prestigious awards including the Yonsei University Academic Excellence Award, Gallup Outstanding Paper Award, National Academy of Sciences Outstanding Publication Award, and Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism Outstanding Publication Award. He also served on the editorial boards of the American Journal of Society and Rationality and Society, the two leading journals in sociology.

Since his term as President, Dr. Kim has implemented the philosophical spirit of 3Cs (Christian Values, Creativity, Connectivity) as the guiding principle of Yonsei University. Based on this, he stipulated 10 policy tasks to be completed by 2020 under the title of "Future Challenges 10 by 20" in order to prepare for the next 100 years as a "future university." In the midst of the great transition of the fourth industrial revolution, he is promoting convergence within the University, especially in teaching, research and social contribution. Under Dr. Kim's leadership, Yonsei opened the Institute for Global Engagement and Empowerment in April 2017 to lay the foundation of empathy and social engagement within Korea as well as all corners of the global community.



Björn Kjerfve Chancellor American University of Sharjah

United Arab Emirates

Dr. Björn Kjerfve leads American University of Sharjah (AUS) on a national, regional and international level. In fostering educational excellence, as well as the development of the institution, he ensures that the university is fully engaged with both the local and international communities. Dr. Kjerfve upholds the overall mission and long-term strategy of AUS, in accordance with its Board of Trustees.

As AUS welcomes its 20th anniversary later in 2017, Dr. Kjerfve is guiding efforts in developing and sustaining long-term research at AUS and is also helping AUS Enterprises LLC to drive the development of the newly established Research, Technology and Innovation (RTI) Park.

Prior to joining AUS, Dr. Kjerfve was President of the World Maritime University (2009–2014), having previously been the Dean of the College of Geosciences and Professor of Oceanography at Texas A&M University (2004-2009). Prior to that, he was Professor of Marine and Geological Sciences at the University of South Carolina and served as the Director of the Marine Science Program (2000–2004).

Dr. Kjerfve holds PhD, MS and BA degrees from Louisiana State University (Marine Sciences), University of Washington (Oceanography) and Georgia Southern University (Mathematics), respectively.

Dr. Kjerfve's scientific expertise is in coastal and estuarine physical oceanography. He has published 13 books and some 250 scientific journal papers, book chapters and reports. He has supervised 14 PhD dissertations and 24 MS theses, and taught more than 6,000 oceanography students. His research focuses on estuarine and coastal waters, as well as climate change, which has attracted US\$20 million in research funding for some 90 projects. In 2013, he became the corresponding member of the Brazilian Academy of Sciences.

Prof. Dr. Susanne Rupp has been Vice President for Academic Affairs at Universität Hamburg since 2014. In 2007 she was appointed Professor of British Studies at the University. Her research interests are in the field of early modern cultural studies with a particular emphasis on the role of religion in early modern English society as well as comparative studies on music and poetry. After studies in Munich, Berlin and Glasgow, she received an M.A. in Musicology, followed by a PhD in English Philology from Technische Universität Berlin, and completed her habilitation at the Free University Berlin in 2004. As Vice President for Academic Affairs she is responsible for under- and postgraduate programmes, adult and continuing education, quality assurance as well as for the enhancement of teaching and learning in higher education.

Dr. Heisook Kim is the 16th President of Ewha Womans University. Dr. Kim is the university's first president to be elected through a direct election in which students, professors, staff members and alumni took part since its foundation in 1886.

Dr. Heisook Kim graduated from Ewha Womans University as an English language and literature major, after which she mastered in Christian Studies. Upon completing her doctorate in philosophy at the University of Chicago, she returned to Ewha as a professor in the philosophy department, where she has taught since 1987. Dr. Kim became the first Dean of Scranton College in 2007 and created the Scranton Honors Program, which allows students to explore different fields of study and benefit scholarships and other opportunities. This program has since been benchmarked by many other universities. In addition to her accomplishments at Ewha, Dr. Kim has successively filled leading posts in national, as well as international academic societies of philosophy including President of the Korean Philosophical Association. She serves as a committee director of the International Federation of Philosophical Societies and is one of nine board members of the International Association of Women Philosophers.

LISE DUMASY is President of the Communauté Université Grenoble Alpes and was the first president of Université Grenoble Alpes from 2016 to December 2017, as well as Stendhal University from 1999 to 2004, and from 2008 to December 2015 (when Stendhal University merged with Pierre Mendès France University and Joseph Fourier University to form the Grenoble Alpes University).

A former student of the Sèvres École Normale Supérieure, Lise Dumasy holds a master's degree in philosophy, is a graduate of classical studies and a doctor of letters. She is a professor of French literature and practices her research activities within the joint research unit Litt&arts.

Very active, Lise Dumasy was director of the Literary and Linguistic Publishing of the University of Grenoble (ELLUG) from 2004 to 2008. During this same period, she chaired during three years the publishers of research and of Higher Education association. During these terms, she chaired the Academic Conference of University Presidents (CAPU), the European pole, and the University Development Agency of Drôme Ardèche (ADUDA).

Lise Dumasy was also a member of the National Council of Higher Education and Research (CNESER) from 2002 to 2009, and a member of the National Committee for Scientific Research (section 35, then CID 50.) between 2007 and the present day. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the Conference of University Presidents (CPU), member of the Athena Alliance, President of the Bibliographic Agency of Higher Education (ABES) and President of the Couperin Consortium Board of Directors.

Dr Eden Woon has been President of Asian Institute of Technology (AIT) since September 1, 2018. AIT is an international institution for graduate education in Bangkok, founded in 1959, promoting technological change and sustainable development in Asia. He also serves as Special Advisor to the Shaw Foundation in Hong Kong. The Shaw Foundation has funded education projects for over 30 years and sponsors the prestigious Shaw Prize in Mathematical Sciences, Life Science and Medicine, and Astronomy. He was most recently the Vice Chairman of Alba Group Asia. The Berlin-headquartered Alba Group is a world-leading environmental engineering company.

From 2010 until 2017, Dr Woon was the Vice-President for Institutional Advancement of the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (HKUST), being responsible for international relations, China affairs, development, alumni, and public relations.

From 2006 to 2010, Dr Woon was the Managing Director of Li & Fung Group's China Office and Managing Director of Toys "R" Us China in Shanghai, and he has also been a Vice-President of Starbucks Coffee Company in China. In 1997-2006, Dr Woon was the CEO of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce.

Dr Woon served in the US Air Force until 1993 when he retired as a Colonel. He once acted as China policy advisor to the US Secretary of Defense. Before that, Dr. Woon taught Mathematics at the US Air Force Academy for six years, becoming an Associate Professor.

Dr Woon received his BA degree from the University of Iowa and his MA, MS, and PhD degrees, all in Mathematics, from the University of Washington in Seattle. He is a Justice of Peace of Hong Kong and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York.

Professor Hideo Ohno received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Tokyo in 1982.

He is currently serving as the 22nd President of Tohoku University. His previous responsibilities at Tohoku University included the roles of Director of the Research Institute of Electrical Communication. Director of the Center for Spintronics Integrated System, Principal Investigator at the WPI Advanced Institute for Materials Research, Professor at the Center for Innovative Integrated Electronic Systems. and Director of the Center for Spintronics Research Network. His research interests include physics and applications of spin phenomena in semiconductors and metal-based nanostructures. Professor Ohno has received the IBM Japan Science Award (1998). the IUPAP Magnetism Prize (2003), the Japan Academy Prize (2005), the Presidential Prize for Research Excellence. Tohoku University (2005) and the 2005 Agilent Technologies Europhysics Prize. He has been a fellow of the Institute of Physics (IOP) since 2004, an honorary professor of the Institute of Semiconductors at the Chinese Academy of Sciences since 2006, a fellow of the Japan Society of Applied Physics (JSAP) since 2007, a fellow of the American Physical Society (APS) since 2012 and a fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers since 2018. The IEEE Magnetics Society named him as Distinguished Lecturer for 2009. He has been awarded the Thomson Reuters Citation Laureate (2011), the JSAP Outstanding Achievement Award, the IEEE David Sarnoff Award (2012), the Institute of Electronics, Information and Communication Engineers (IEICE) Electronics Society Award (2014), the JSAP Compound Semiconductor Electronics Achievement Award (2015), the Leo Esaki Prize (2016) and the C&C Prize (2016). He was also appointed as a Distinguished Professor at Tohoku University.




